



RESTORE THE BALANCE: WHOSE IDEA WAS THIS, ANYWAY?



January 2021

Two friends, shocked and angered by the events of January 6th, 2021, anxiously awaited a reaction from local community leaders against extremism. When opposition failed to materialize, they decide to take action themselves.



April - October 2021

Listening campaign commences with scores of people in pubs and coffee shops



November 2021

Meeting of a dozen interested people takes place



January 23, 2022

A group of six founders agree to put their name on an op-ed which is published in the Grand Junction Daily Sentinel



May 17, 2022

Over 500 people attend the inaugural meeting of Restore the Balance



March 16, 2022

Restore the Balance is formed as a 501(c)(4) non-profit corporation




February 27 and March 6, 2022

Over 700 individuals sign on to two full-page ads endorsing the values and principles in the op-ed



June 2022 - June 2023

Scores of volunteers and hundreds of supporters take actions to oppose extremism and promote seven principles for a new approach to politics based on facts, honesty, collaboration, and civil dialogue


Over 2900 people have joined the effort

RTB's Founding Principals

- L. Political Parties, Citizens, and elected officials should vigorously compete over values, principles, and ideas. However, citizens are not just spectators; they are integral players in this process. Their active participation is crucial, and they must also find common ground to solve problems and pass needed legislation.
- 2. Facts, supported by objectively examined evidence, are the basis for what to believe and how to act.
- 3. No one person or political party has a monopoly on the best public policy proposals; communication and good faith negotiations are essential to the legislative process
- 4. The public interest must come before party interests for voters and elected officials alike
- 5. Extremists of all kinds attract supporters and money by appealing to fears and resentments, amplifying divisions instead of genuinely addressing problems
- 6. Citizens should be free to run for or hold office without being threatened or harassed
- 7. Citizens may certainly exercise their freedoms, but they may recognize their responsibilities to the community.

RTB WANTS TO BUILD AN ALTERNATIVE TO EXTREMISM IN OUR POLITICS

 Extremism in politics contributes to gridlock, distrust, and the destabilization of the nation's civil, governmental, and institutional structures. But....

What is extremism?

EXTREMISM IS:

- The denial of objective reality, promoting the "Big Lie" that the 2020 Presidential Election was stolen.
- Seeing or hearing only one side of the story
- Prioritizing partisan interest before public interest
- Use of intimidation and name-calling instead of respectful disagreement.
- Engaging in combative and divisive discourse
- Tolerating or encouraging violence
- Appealing to fears, resentment, and class warfare
- Those that are more interested in dividing us than uniting us.





How do we Bridge The Gap?

"Most people do not listen with the intent to understand; they listen with the intent to reply."

Through Respectful Discourse

- Avoid judgmental words and name-calling
- Focus on the common good
- Identify shared values and identities
- Listen and debate ideas
- Respect divergent opinions
- Use facts



The Candidate Questionnaire Process

- Candidates are allowed to respond to our questionnaires
- Their responses are rated using a weighted average scoring process
- Candidates are assessed based on their responses to the questionnaire and independent research





Election topics:

- 1. Supports RTB's principles
- 2. Putting public interest ahead of party
- 3. Qualified to serve
- 4. Grasp of issues



Candidates were scored based on responses to each topic:

CO State House of Reps. Dist. 59

Clark Craig 96%

Katie Stewart 100%

CO State Senate Senator Dist. 6

Cleave Simpson: 100%

Vivian Smotherman: 100%

La Plata County Commissioner

Paul Black: 96%

Matt Salka: 100%

Marsha Porter-Norton: 100%

La Plata County Treasurer

Moni Grushkin: 100%

It is important for the voters to know none of these eight candidates portrayed extremism in their responses. The questions, the candidate's full responses.
